Are You a Visitor or Guest? We welcome you in the name of our risen Savior and we rejoice that you are here today to praise God with us. Please complete a **CONNECTION CARD** in your pew. Either place it in the offering plate or give it to one of our pastors so we can serve you better.

Holy Communion—We believe that Christ is present in this meal freely given to all who are baptized. Please approach the altar as directed. Receive the host and then dip the host (*gluten free wafers are available for the asking*) into either the red wine or the white grape juice and eat, or place the host in your mouth then pick up a cup of either the red wine or the white grape juice and drink. Deposit your empty cup in the basket at the end of the line. All children are invited to come forward for a blessing if they do not normally receive communion. Return to your seat (or pause at the altar) for a time of prayer. If you are unable to come to the altar and would like communion in your pew, please let an usher or a pastor know.

Council Highlights from November 2025

MOTION To accept the corrected minutes from October2025, was carried.

FINANCE: Through October our donations are \$19,248 below our spending, which includes the Fellowship balance of \$5178. This is \$41,986 below last year when we had a positive difference of \$22,738. Through October, envelope offerings are \$27,049 below last year (7% dec.), plate offerings are up \$2348, and holiday offerings are down \$646. Total income is down \$22,908 compared to last year (4.7% dec.). Through October, our expenses are \$1,114 below our 2025 spending plan showing we are doing a good job of holding expenses down. Expenses are above last year by \$21,849 (4.6%inc.). Due to another \$50,000 received toward the mortgage principal, we are on schedule to have it paid of by early May 2026. Donations are down. We are \$14,000 below our spending plan. Even though the mortgage will be paid off, we have some higher dollar 'household' expenses that will continue, such as taxes and insurance.

PROPERTY: Ditch by back drive is being worked on to try to fill in. Security company came to review what is in place (he mentioned that many churches do not have even 10% of our security), though there is room for improvement. A written assessment is forthcoming.

MUTUAL MINISTRY: Council reviewed spending plan. Recommended 3.5% staff increase.

MOTION: to increase church staff salaries by 3.5% passed with one decent. **MOTION:** to accept the spending plan with an increase of \$200 for the organist that was not on original spending plan passed with one decent.

PASTORS' TIME: Pastor Ken presented the Membership report. **MOTION:** to accept membership report passed.

YOUR INPUT: THOUGHTS, CONCERNS FROM THE CONGREGATION—A parishioner suggested more time between services.

NEW BUSINESS: 1. Nominating committee completed nominations. Mission Endowment: Joe Anderson, Judy Platz, Pat Isom. Council: Richard Schnur, Doug Buuck, Beau Beaudine.

CORRESPONDENCES: Thank you's received from: Tender Hearts for the Halloween candy/goody bags; from CARE for our support; AGAPE for \$405 donation; from Back Pack Kidz for support and generosity; from Gateway Center for World Mission/Eric Twine for gift of \$3600; to Women's Bible Study for sending birthday cards to Crossroads kids and \$405 donation. A request of support of the Native American Outreach Program for American and Alaskan native people; Harry Chapin request for contribution to their Thanksgiving matching funds campaign.

It will resume on Tuesday January 13th at 10:00 am.

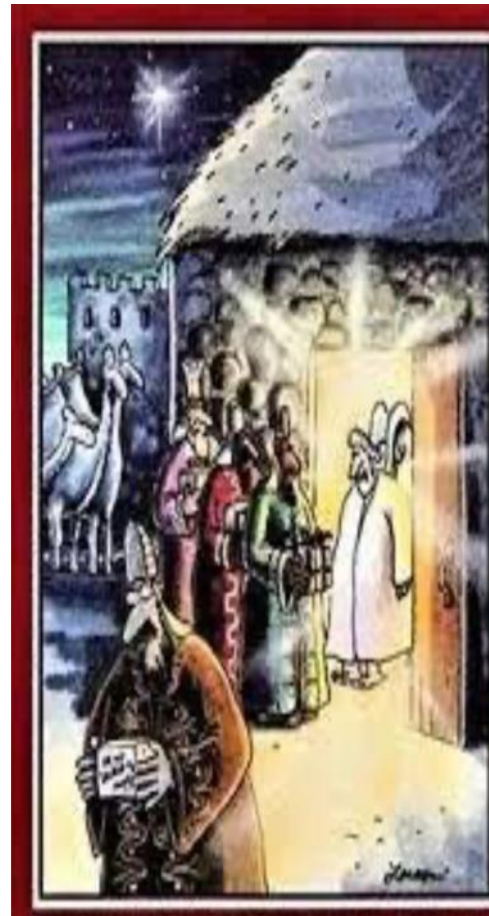
2026 OFFERING ENVELOPES
