



Council Highlights from September 2025

MOTION To accept the minutes from August 2025, was carried.

OLD BUSINESS: Food Pantry shelves installed.

FINANCE: Through August our donations are \$14,633 below our spending, which includes the Fellowship balance of \$4077. This is \$32,672 below last year. Through August, envelope offerings are \$18,942 below last year, plate offerings are up \$3979.45 and mortgage offerings are up by \$416. Total income is down \$16,127.89 compared to last year, which is a 4.2% decrease. Through August, our expenses are \$17,678.44 below our 2025 spending plan but above last year by \$17,741.18, which is a 4.8% increase.

PROPERTY: A. At last month's meeting, \$3800 was approved to fix the courtyard flooding issues. \$300 was used to have a plumber snake (with camera) the drains in the courtyard. One drain cleared, but backs up. Second drain was severely blocked with sludge. Realizing this required more work, a **MOTION** to approve \$5400 (\$3800+\$1600) to fix the courtyard flooding issue, was carried. **B.** Property asked to make a **MOTION** to approve \$8800 for two new AC units for the food pantry (carried). **C.** Front sign is no longer working. Three options: 1. \$3300 to get bottom portion fixed with new technology; 2. \$20,000 to update the technology on entire sign. No decision was made since there

was not enough information. Further quotes will be gotten. **MUTUAL MINISTRY:** No report

PASTORS' TIME: It was suggested on Sundays at 10: 30 to have fellowship doors closed and at the 10:45 service to have congregation sing a verse before the beginning to prepare themselves for worship. **YOUR INPUT: THOUGHTS, CONCERNS, WHAT ARE YOU HEARING FROM THE CONGREGATION**—Discussion on the attendance during the summer one service, as well as the new paraments on the altar. Also discussed was the new way to purchase gift cards.

NEW BUSINESS: Food pantry—It was suggested to inventory the food pantry so there is an idea on exactly what is needed. Positions for Council: Three are open which are currently held by Beau, Mike, and Richard. All three can run again. Positions for Endowment—1 position is open and two can run again. Online directory—still having issues.

CORRESPONDENCES: Thank you received from: Shoes for Kidz thank you from Sunrise Kiwanis; Jesue Loves You for our support; letter from Very Rev. Eric Twin for our donations and continued support with Church of Uganda Anglican.


